

The Longest Night of the Year

Thank you for joining us at the Central Florida Homeless Persons' Memorial Service. Today, we commemorate the lives of those in our community who have passed away in 2020 after having experienced homelessness. It is a time for family, friends, advocates, community leaders and service providers to come together and show respect for the valued lives of these most vulnerable neighbors. In many cases, this service will be the only commemoration of their passing.

The Homeless Persons' Memorial Service has been held in Central Florida since 2002. Each year the names of those lost from Orange, Seminole and Osceola counties are read and honored.

This service is always held near December 21, the longest night of the year, in recognition of the difficulties that nighttime causes for those who have no home. Similar services will be held in more than 125 cities across the nation, providing the respect and honor the passing of any life deserves.
